#### **VET NOTES** Sharon Hoofnagle D.V.M. Grumpy Horses

Dr Sue Dysen is one of the foremost authorities on relating equine body posture and behaviors to determining discomfort in the horse. At the Dec 2022 meeting of the American Assoc of Equine Practitioners she presented a paper on "How to Recognize Signs of Abnormal Equine Behavior During Tacking-Up and Mounting and to Understand Their Potential Clinical Significance."

Her basic message was that grumpy behavior when a horse is being saddled is not normal and may indicate an underlying health issue. When the behavior was recognized, an underlying issue was looked for. When the issue was corrected the grumpy saddling behavior disappeared.

Grumpy behavior can include avoiding the bridle, pinning of ears, tail swishing, biting, kicking, teeth grinding, reluctance to open the mouth for the bit; fidgeting, nose-rubbing, licking and chewing, tail swishing, and looking at the girth.

Inciting issues could include lameness, dental issues, saddle fit, back pain, psychological, or abdominal problems. One of our first treatments for a grumpy horse is for ulcers. The treatment is often successful. However medical practice can be challenging. The gastric or colonic ulcers may be the result of chronic pain elsewhere. The ulcers and grumpy behavior may reoccur if the underlying cause isn't corrected.

Resentment could be due to the actual saddling itself but may be due to chronic pain while ridden or chronic pain unrelated to saddling or riding that makes the horse grumpy. Many humans can relate to that. Get a chronic pain issue corrected and the whole world is a lot brighter.

#### **WBCH General meeting minutes Jan 11 2023**

The meeting was called to order by Roger Edmonds at 7:05 pm at the Laurel Grange. It was preceded by a 30 min social time. Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Roger called for a "roll call" Members stated their name.

Approval of last month's minutes as printed in the newsletter was asked for: Tim moved and Joe seconded.

#### REPORTS

<u>Treasurers</u> (financial officer): Tim V: the balances can be requested by members, we are up \$290. Tim, Verna, Jackie, and Roger were on the budget committee. Due to the delay in memberships coming in through Jan it will be revised. The board will look at it at the Feb board meeting, membership will vote on it at the Feb general meeting.

**Directors**: Joe R-

State BCH leadership training is Sat Jan 28<sup>th</sup>. It has been changed to virtual. Sign up through the State BCH website (or the email notice) A second part will be held Feb 4<sup>th</sup>- the 4th is mainly on grants.

**Legislative day** is Feb 6<sup>th</sup> in Olympia. Bill is arranging our participation. Folks should wear western gear (western hats, etc.) Tim V will contact legislators. He will also draft a position paper for attendees so we can present a unified group. Carpooling is recommended.

**Rendezvous** is March 17-19 in Ellensburg. Folks should get their hotel rooms booked soon. Go online to the state website to buy dinner reservations. The tack sale is being moved to the armory where there is more room. Also, circus tents will be set up for events. A first aid class will be offered, also the classroom part of the chainsaw class will be offered. Bill has reserved two tables.

**Website** (state) has been improved. The Legacy Trail Grant is described. Packers are asked to submit info on what they can do (stock, experience, equipment). This will help in planning work.

Summer work parties are being scheduled, Jason has a tentative schedule for Washington

**Executive committee** (state) is locking in on a contract for a lobbyist. The sawyer program is being worked on, Dana C is working on a youth program.

**By-laws: (chapter)** were approved the end of 2022, they formally establish an executive board. The board will take care of most of the chapter business, the issues will then go the membership for a vote. This will streamline the meeting and make more time for presentations and fun events.

Volunteer hrs. Verna M- we had 354 hrs. in Nov., 8.5 hrs. in Dec.

#### Trailheads

Saxon- Joe R- checked it out a few days ago, the gate was locked

**South Fork**- status is unknown. We need to find out from Parks Dept how we can get more involved. Several members have ridden the area, it will give us gentler trails to ride. A few members rode it recently to try to find the new trail markers.

**Y Rd- Stewart-** Sharon H- the 15-mile loop may still be blocked on the south side. The horse crossing of Olsen Creek near the tree farm has a plastic barrier just before the creek which is passable but may be spooky to stock.

**Silver Lake**: Bill- the barn remodel is on hold although the park has approved it. Tim V, Bill, and Rocky checked out Silver Lake. The big circle may be partially on private land. DNR and Red Mt sites- there is stock parking for horses ½ way down Baker Lake Rd.

**Dead Horse Trail**: it is the access to Skyline. Bill, Rocky, and Tim V checked it out. It is the main access to Skyline but the road is blown out. There are alternatives but the only sustainable option is major with 4 creek crossings. GAO (Great American Trails Act grants) funds may be available. WTA has the most at risk with losing this access. There is no stock access to Skyline right now. Hikers have a long hike but can get in.

**Computer**: Tim V- the new computer is here.

**Trailer:** Joe R- the etrack needs to be installed. Costco has shelving. Tim V- don't hesitate to ask for reimbursement for expenses. It is only \$2.50 for state to write a reimbursement check. Costco requires a Visa card, our is a Mastercard. However, we can buy a Costco cash card. Bill and Sharon suggested that this be a board discussion.
