VET NOTES Sharon Hoofnagle D.V.M Laminitis (again)

Laminitis is at the top of the list as one of the most frustrating and common health issues for Pacific NW horses. Our fast growing lush grasses and abrupt seasonal changes are a "perfect storm" for laminitis.

This is a repeat of a spring laminitis alert, but this condition is so painful and potentially devastating, if it saves even one horse it is worth it.

Here are some seasonal reminders

This is an extreme danger time for laminitis. Cold nights and warm days concentrates sugars in the grasses. The grass is growing rapidly. Consequently horses turned out on lush pastures can consume a large amount of high sugar grasses. possibly resulting in laminitis. Here are some facts.

Avoid laminitis. Don't wait to see if it occurs. Early bouts of laminitis may not be painful. There will be no way to detect it. Changes in the foot may be permanent.

Some conditions that may affect your horse will greatly increase the probability of laminitis occurring. Have your veterinarian evaluate your horse for metabolic conditions, such as Cushings or equine metabolic syndrome. Avoid obesity. Regularly weight tape your horse. Regional adiposity (cresty necks and fat pads) indicate

equine metabolic syndrome.

Avoid grains or excess hand treats, even carrots. They are high in sugars. Measure your pasture growth by watching your lawn. It is impossible to determine pasture growth while stock are grazing it. In December they may be getting 2 lbs. a days off of it. In April it may be the same height but they may be consuming 30 lbs. a day.

A guideline for cold nights is 40 degrees F. Nighttime temps lower than this will concentrate sugars. Early morning grazing is safest; grasses accumulate sugar during the day through photosynthesis. When transitioning from hay to pasture start with 20 min per day for several days. Then gradually increase the time.

Some horses cannot be on pasture full time Methods for limiting grass intake are limiting grazing time, limiting area by cross fencing, or grazing muzzles.

Whatcom Chapter of Backcountry Horsemen Minutes of Monthly Meeting April 12, 2017

The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

Approval of Minutes: Motion was made and seconded to approve the March 2017 minutes. Motion carried.

<u>Guest Speaker</u>: Sharron Sherfick (Lions Camp Horizon). Sharron gave an overview of Camp Horizon with campers coming from six counties and B.C. She wanted to see if our chapter was interested in bringing horses to Camp Horizon to introduce them to the campers. This would be for the Adventure Camp sessions only (07/30-08/02, 08/06-08/09, and 08/13-08/16). Carol Ketchum will head up a committee for people interested in participating. Call her if interested (360-201-5474). Chic Long will help out.

Chain Saw Certification: Rodney Vandersypen, Walden Haines, Bill McKenna, Joe Remenar and Roger Nelson are now certified for sawing, both chain saws and cross-cut saws. Our chapter received \$575 from Whatcom Mt. Bike Coalition. They participated in the chain saw certification, but because the class was given to BCH, the participants had to be members. Rather than joining the chapter they donated the same amount of money to us.

<u>Director's Report</u>: Bill McKenna reported that BCHW was first in the nation to have an in-house sawyer certification course. He has a few calendars left. Rendezvous was successful. Executive Director Darrell Wallace resigned and the new Executive Director is Nicole Sedgewick. The state-wide work party north of Priest Lake will be held in August. <u>Bears</u> - Bill mentioned anything north of I-90 is eligible to get bears.

Volunteer Hours: Verna has an easier template members can use to turn hours into her. She will have Fran email it out. She also reported the March volunteer hours were 273.5.

DNR Volunteer Hours: Rodney and Mike turned in hours.

<u>Work Parties/Trail Coordinator/Bosses</u>: Roger reported that nine people helped on the work party for the Easter egg ride to be held on Sat. Rocky will lead the first group leaving at 9:00; Roger will lead the second group leaving at 10:00; lunch is at noon. Trail bosses Cindy and Joe will have other, smaller groups rides, also.

<u>DNR Rec Plan</u>: Walden reported the group has been meeting for over a year and they will be meeting into 2018 to assimilate all the information gathered on what the public wants. Then the SEPA plan will kick in and the public will see it.

Trailheads:

<u>South Fork Park</u>: Rodney reported the County is waiting on the weather to pave the road to the parking lots for the hikers and horses, but there won't be any trails for a while. The agreement to Nessett Farm has been signed and finalized. The work party here is on June 4.

Lake Whatcom work party scheduled for June 3 has been moved to June 4.




